









As we celebrate the 5th Anniversary of Star Air, we take a nostalgic flight through the milestones, achievements, and the unwavering commitment that has defined this incredible journey. It's impossible not to reflect on the numerous accolades and achievements the airline has garnered. From industry awards to consistently high customer satisfaction ratings, Star Air has proven that excellence is not just a goal but a way of life.

Looking ahead, Star Air has ambitious plans for expansion, which include introducing new routes and enhancing the overall travel experience. The next five years promise to be even more exciting as the airline continues to push the boundaries of what air travel can be. As Star Air looks towards the future, its commitment remains



steadfast: to soar higher, innovate further, and continue being a beacon of excellence in the aviation industry. Here's to five years of soaring high and to the countless journeys yet to come with Star Air.

A Humble Start-up Effort to a Great Launch

The airline, Star Air, is the brainchild of the respected chairman, Shri Sanjay Ghodawat, who possesses a fervent vision for aviation and already owned a fleet of modern helicopters at the time of inception. The decision to embark on this project arose during turbulent times in Indian aviation. However, the confidence and faith exhibited by the management served as a statement





to the aviation community about the arrival of Star Air. The capable leadership of our CEO, Mr. Simran Singh Tiwana, who was selected to execute the task, gave our humble journey a kick-start. As for the direction of our journey, the honourable Government of India sparked the vision of UDAN (Ude Desh ka Aam Naagrik), connecting Tier 2 cities and below with metros and beyond. Star Air, upon realizing the potential, decided to embark on a journey that had never been attempted before.

The biggest challenge for Star Air's team was to find the right aircraft that would surpass the expectations of passengers. After various brainstorming sessions, they introduced jet comfort to the "aam naagrik" (common citizen). The market presented a unique opportunity, and a perfect match was found in the Embraer 145 jets, which had revolutionized shuttle-hopping flights in the west. The original equipment manufacturer (OEM), Embraer, responded positively to the idea, further solidifying the choice.

The hunt for perfect airframes led Star Air to North America, specifically to the airfields of Nevada, where five ideal airframes were carefully chosen, laying the foundation for the airline's journey forward. Dating from 2017 when the aircraft were finalized until January 2019, a dedicated team of passionate individuals exerted their maximum capabilities to turn the vision into reality—from the drawing board to the first flight. The aircraft underwent modifications, stripping, painting, and testing before embarking on a long three-day flight from the west to reach

the gardenscape of Bengaluru.

The new cabin experience introduced by Star Air, unique and unmatched by conventional narrowbody aircraft, was an immediate hit among passengers. Booking an Embraer 145 with Star Air provided a probability of 72% of flying in a window seat and a 36% chance of enjoying the luxury of a single seat - combining window and aisle comfort. The overwhelming response from passengers to such a cabin configuration has strengthened the airline's belief in choosing the right aircraft for UDAN and offering a unique experience tailored to India's aviation landscape.

From Bengaluru to Hubballi and Beyond—A Chronicle of Growth, Success and Unforgettable Journeys

On 25th January 2019, Star Air embarked

on its maiden voyage, connecting the bustling city of Bengaluru with the vibrant hub of Hubballi. Little did the world know then, that this humble beginning would mark the start of an extraordinary journey that would redefine air travel in India.

As Star Air took flight for the first time, it wasn't just another airline entering the market, but rather a vision taking shape. The route from Bengaluru to Hubballi was carefully chosen, symbolizing the airline's commitment to connecting tier-II cities with major metropolitan hubs, thereby fostering growth and accessibility. Buoyed by the success of its inaugural route, the airline embarked on a journey of expansion, introducing new destinations and routes across India. Each new route served as a testament to Star Air's dedication to accessibility and inclusivity in air travel.

A Vision Continuing From a Great Launch to the Podium

Breaking Barriers: The Journey of Star Air's First Female Pilot

When she's not soaring through the clouds, she's exploring coral reefs and championing the cause of animal welfare with unwavering passion. First Officer—Ashwini Bhaskare, opens up about becoming Star Air's first female pilot.

Q. How do you feel about breaking barriers and being a trailblazer in the aviation industry?

A. Women have been involved in aviation since its inception, defying societal norms to venture into this male-dominated field. The history of women in aviation dates back to the

early 20th century, where courageous pioneers like *Sarla Thukral* and *Durba Banerjee* stand out as early trailblazers, whose passion for flying and determination paved the way for future generations of female aviators. I am definitely lucky to be part of this significant change which is being powered by the remarkable emergence of female leadership in the aviation

industry. I would say it is time to rise above the conventional thinking focused on the differences between genders. "We need to concentrate on what we share in common—the passionate spirit in all our hearts, which has created us the way we are and compels us to choose to be a part of something much bigger than ourselves."



Q. How do you envision your role influencing and inspiring future generations of female pilots?


A. I believe most of the time we get inspired by watching somebody else achieve something bigger. Which brings in the role for a girl like me to reach the heights from where I can bring in positive influence and awareness amongst women to believe in themselves and achieve bigger goals. The scarcity of female mentors and role models in high-ranking aviation positions can make it difficult for aspiring women to envision their own success. I would be happy to support women through mentorship programmes which are essential in fostering a culture of female leadership.

Q. How do you maintain a healthy work-life balance in a demanding profession like piloting?

A. The very first thing that I have learnt from my mother who was also a working woman, is there is no such thing as perfect work-life balance. So basically do not waste your precious time to achieve something which is hypothetical. We just have to bring harmony in work-life areas. One of the challenges of being a pilot is dealing with unpredictable schedules, long hours, and frequent travel. This can make it hard to plan ahead, manage your time, and stay in touch with your loved ones. To avoid burnout and stress, you need to set some boundaries and prioritize your needs. I remember my Instructor gave me a simple formula for this 'Be Flexible and Resilient and most importantly, Be Content'.

Q. How do you approach teamwork and collaboration in the cockpit?

A. As we all know, a bad decision made in the air can have critical implications, especially in a highly sensitive environment such as an aircraft cockpit. For decades, amongst reputable operators, it has become an environment that has set the benchmark for effective communication and optimal teamwork. One should have an open-minded attitude and be open to constructive criticism, even if it's from the newest employee on the front line. We have a set of standard operating procedures which helps us in effective teamwork. I still practise patience every day and manage to maintain a positive atmosphere throughout my work schedule.



Q. What advice would you give to other women aspiring to become pilots or pursue careers in male-dominated fields?

A. Well, my advice is the same for men and women alike... which is to become the master of your aircraft. Sure, being the 'ONLY' in the room can feel uncomfortable sometimes. Yes, women do endure some unique challenges in certain places. To them I say, remind yourself that you are following your dream. Remember that only you can define success for yourself and nobody else. The best way to navigate through difficulties is to work diligently to master your craft. Identify gaps in knowledge within your team and take the initiative to become an indispensable expert in those areas. Have the confidence to break through the noise by staying true to your vision. You will achieve success on your own terms, regardless of the environment you find yourself in. Nobody wants to lead a scripted life. It's ok to dream big, go against the status guo and be different. It's perfectly ok to risk failure in the pursuit of personal growth. I would say, stay true to your values and chart your own course.

Q. Can you tell us about your journey to becoming the first female pilot for Star Air?

A. I thank Star Air, for giving me an opportunity to begin with my career. Honestly speaking, I never thought that I would be the first female pilot for Star Air.
